Anthropology is concerned with how humans and human societies evolve culturally and biologically. Anthropology explores the differences and similarities among human cultures and the evolutionary and biocultural processes that influence human biological diversity. It integrates a wide range of perspectives on human behavior, culture, and society. Students in the Anthropology Minor program will become familiar with the basic concerns of archaeology, biological anthropology, cultural anthropology, and linguistic anthropology via the required introductory courses. Additional elective credits for the Minor provide flexibility for students to pursue their specific interests within Anthropology.

Required courses for the Anthropology minor

The anthropology major requires the completion of 18 credits distributed as follows. Students must complete the three core courses in Anthropology (ANTH 0582, ANTH 0680, and ANTH 0780) with a grade of C or better.

Core courses

ANTH 0582 Introduction to Archaeology ANTH 0680 Introduction to Biological Anthropology ANTH 0780 Introduction to Cultural Anthropology

Elective courses

Students are required to complete a minimum of 9 elective credits in ANTH courses. Of the 9 credits required, at least 6 must be completed at the 1000-level. Any 1000-level ANTH course may be taken toward fulfillment of this requirement, with the exception of independent studies courses ANTH 19xx.
