Students that major in Korean will acquire knowledge about Korean culture and history and a comprehensive training in the Korean language. The non-language courses will allow students to study Korean cultural history, traditional and modern literature, creative and performing arts (including film), as well as contemporary Korean popular culture. The language courses will provide students with training in speaking, listening, and writing in the Korean language in ways that lead to successful intercultural communication.
